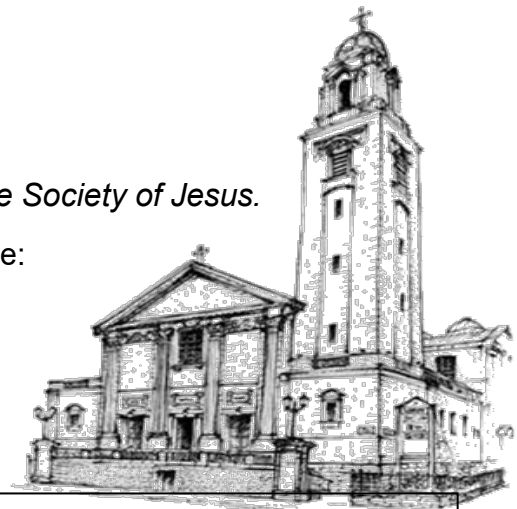

Novena to the Sacred Heart: As the Church prepares to celebrate the Feast of the Sacred Heart on Friday 12 June, *Pray As You Go* is inviting people to join in a novena prayer written by the late Fr Simon Bishop SJ, a much-loved Jesuit priest. The nine-day prayer journey invites participants to reflect on God's love through Scripture, meditation and prayer. Those taking part are encouraged to pray at their own pace, listening carefully to each day's Scripture passage and meditation, pausing when something speaks to them.
