# Why 'Caesarea Phillipi?

The gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke all point out that Jesus revealed himself as Messiah in the region of <u>Caesarea Phillipi</u>. Why? Perhaps because this was the most remote part of the country, in the extreme north, where there would be a better chance of keeping the revelation private. Many zealots were looking for a Messiah who would lead the people into battle against the Romans and thus establish the reign of the true God. Jesus could easily be seen as that kind of fanatic, and the true nature of his mission misunderstood. Indeed, there was a great challenge for Jesus to guide his disciples into a right understanding.


