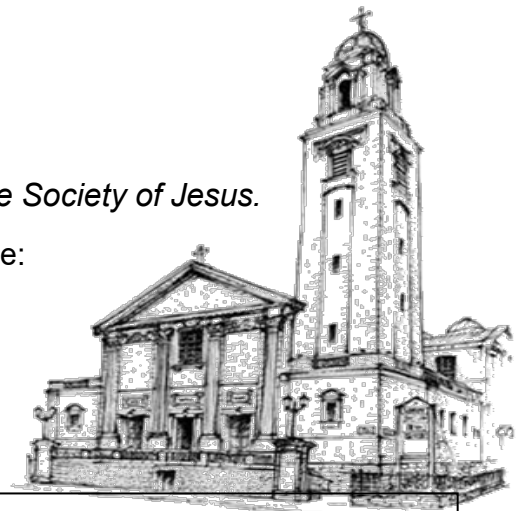

**THE PENTECOST VIGIL MASS
SATURDAY 24th MAY 5 PM**

Fifty days after the high feast of Easter, the Church comes together to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. It is one of the principal feasts of the year and marks the end of the Easter season.

The current Roman Missal has revived this extended vigil and this we will celebrated at the 5 p.m. Mass on Saturday 24th May. Similar to the Easter Vigil, there are four readings from

the Old Testament that are read. These readings point to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost starting in Genesis, and ending in the book of Joel.

After the fourth reading and its Psalm is completed, the Gloria is sung. Then a reading from Romans is recited, which recalls how the Holy Spirit helps us in our need. The Gospel is then proclaimed and Mass continues as usual.
