Assisted Dying: What does it all mean?

Liam McArthur MSP is proposing a bill to legalise assisted dying. This will undermine the right to life and put vulnerable people at risk of coming under pressure to end their lives prematurely. A series of Holyrood Webinars on Assisted Dying, Euthanasia and Palliative Care will be shown featuring Professor Marie Fallon, University of Edinburgh, Dr Miro Griffiths, University of Leeds, Dr Leonie Herx, Queens University, Kingston, Canada and Tanni Grey Thompson, television presenter and former wheelchair racer. Discussion will follow and Gordon McDonald, CEO of Care not Killing will be in attendance. All are welcome.

Dying Well
Dr Gillian Wright 2.00 pm Saturday 24 June
Ogilvie Centre, St Aloysius Church.

How quality palliative care is the alternative to assisted suicide.

Medical ethicist and former Palliative care doctor Dr Gillian Wright explains how the end of life can be managed with care and compassion. Dr Wright is a medical doctor who trained in general hospital medicine and palliative care. She changed to work in the sphere of medical ethics in 2018 and worked for the Scottish Council on Human Bioethics in Edinburgh until 2020. She now works for the campaign Our Duty of Care, which opposes the introduction of assisted suicide and euthanasia to the UK. The UK leads the world in palliative 'end of life' care. The modern hospice movement was founded here and palliative care has been recognised as a specialist branch of medicine for over 30 years.

Good palliative care attends to the needs of the patient as a whole, whether those needs are physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual or social. Through effective pain management, and good communication with the patient, symptoms can be well controlled.

Foodbank

Plans for the Future

We are beginning to think of plans to improve the two confessionals at the back of the church, and possibly to re-work the baptistry area, whilst at the same time upgrading the entrances. More details on this as ideas get formulated.

Hospital Pastoral Care

Remember (a) if you know you are going in to hospital and want Confession and the Sacrament of the Sick, please ask Canon Gargaro before you go, (b) if you are taken in as an emergency ask the nurse to contact the on-call chaplain or call the parish, and (c) if you are in hospital for a longer time you can receive Holy Communion regularly in the ward, but only if you ask the nurse or contact the parish. The chaplains will not be told you are in hospital and cannot visit you automatically – you must specifically ask to see the Catholic chaplain.

Deanery Council

As the next stage in the process of "Looking to the Future" of the Diocese the Deanery Council, made up of all the parish priests and one representative from each parish, met last Tuesday to discuss ideas about evangelisation and help plan for the future.
