

Archbishop Nolan was present in Rome in June for the Mass at which the Holy Father blessed the Palliums of the new Metropolitan Archbishops. Pope Francis' practice is then to ask the Nuncio to bestow the Pallium on the new Archbishop in his Metropolitan Cathedral. This Rite will be celebrated by the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Gugerotti, during a Mass in Saint Andrew's Metropolitan Cathedral, Clyde Street, on Saturday 22nd October at 12.00 noon. Stella Reekie: Glasgow's Interfaith Pioneer (1922-1982) Sunday 2nd of October, 2-4pm St Mungo Museum of Religious Life and Art, 2 Castle Street, G4 0RH

This year marks 100 years since the birth of Stella Reekie and 40 years since her death. A true trail blazer, Stella was a nurse and Church of Scotland missionary who worked with refugees and orphans during World War II, and later, in the 1970s, turned her Glasgow home into a safe space for dialogue and friendship among the increasingly diverse population in the Woodlands area. The Church of Scotland then purchased the "International Flat" in Glasgow Street, where Stella introduced many people on a journey of mutual learning and friendship that we are still benefiting from to this day. Join us to learn about Stella's life and legacy from some of the people who knew her best, and who were inspired by her to establish Glasgow's first interfaith group "Glasgow Sharing of Faiths" and to continue to develop interfaith relations in Scotland and beyond.
