**Pope Leo's intention for December**: **for Christians in areas of conflict** Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

**The "O Antiphons" of Advent** accompany the *Magnificat* canticle of Evening Prayer from December 17-23. They are a magnificent theology that uses ancient biblical imagery drawn from the messianic hopes of the Old Testament to proclaim the coming Christ as the fulfilment not only of Old Testament hopes, but present ones as well. Their repeated use of the imperative "Come!" embodies the longing of all for the Divine Messiah.

**December 21** O Radiant Dawn, splendour of eternal light, sun of justice:

come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

**December 22** O King of all nations and keystone of the Church:

come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

**December 23** O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!
