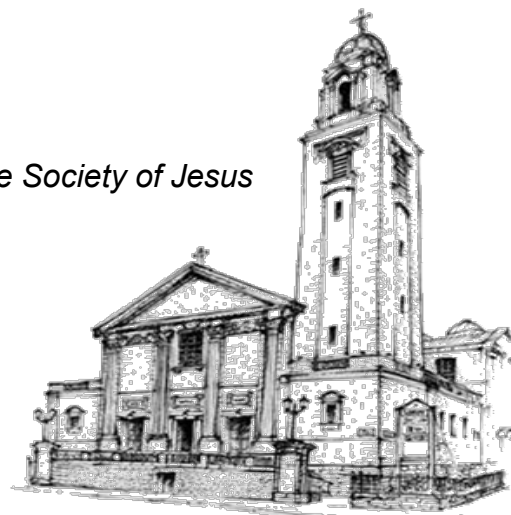

Message from the SSVP: *"We remain very grateful for your ongoing support for our Society and our members, which enables us to provide vital person-to-person assistance to people experiencing all forms of poverty across Scotland. Sadly, the need for this support remains ever present. We are conducting a very short, anonymous survey, which should take around three minutes to complete. The survey will help us understand national awareness of St Vincent de Paul Society in Scotland, and our works. We will use the results to identify opportunities to make it easier for anyone who needs our help to reach us. We are sharing the survey widely to allow people from different areas, faiths, and walks of life, to participate. The flyer is provided in both landscape (better for printing) and portrait form (better for social media) and can be displayed or shared in bulletins or on parish Facebook pages to allow parishioners to participate and share onwards with friends and family. We are also very happy to have the flyers forwarded to other organisations who may wish to distribute the survey wider. The flyer does not mention our charity name, described instead as a National Charity. This is deliberate to help ensure genuine responses to the survey. Shroud of Turin – 20th September: Shroud Of Turin In February, David McKenzie, a parishioner and a member of the British Shroud of Turin Society, gave an illustrated talk on one of the most fascinating of Christian relics – the Shroud of Turin. Many believe that this is the actual shroud that the body of Jesus was wrapped in after his crucifixion, and it certainly is the most discussed and most examined relic in Christendom. David will be repeating the talk about the Shroud, its history, the latest discoveries, why it causes so much controversy and the unanswered questions that still surround it.
