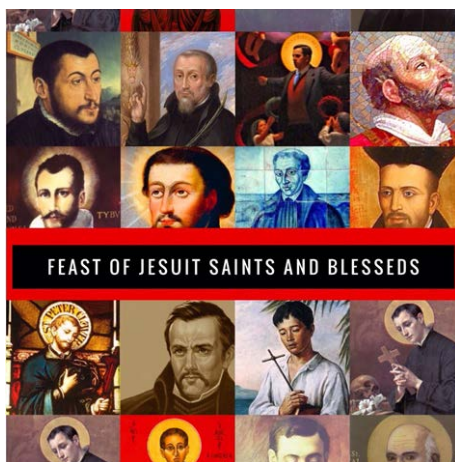
## November Lists for the Dead

This year, from 3<sup>rd</sup> November, there will be a box at the back of the Church before Mass each day for mass intentions. Put the names on a slip of paper and placed them in the box. The box will be placed on the sanctuary and the priest will offer the mass for the intentions in the box that day. You can email names to Alison at [officemanagerstalloysius@gmail.com](mailto:officemanagerstalloysius@gmail.com) and she will add them to the box just before the Church opens each morning.

**Halloween** gets its name because it is *All Hallows' Eve* (i.e. the evening before the feast of 'All Saints'). 'Hallowed be thy name' in the Our Father means '*May Your name be held Holy.*'

The 5<sup>th</sup> November is traditionally the feast of  
**"All Saints of the Society of Jesus."**

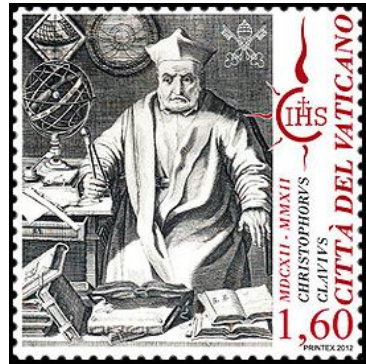

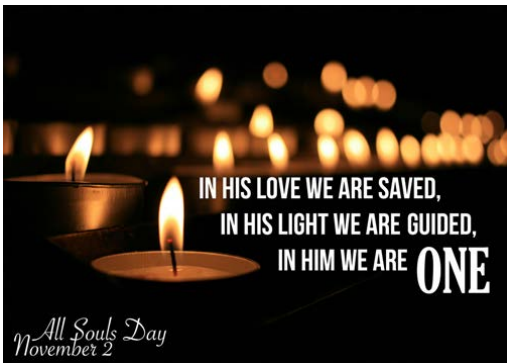

## **All Souls Day is Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November**

A day of remembrance for those who have died. Because of COVID restrictions if we were to have mass on that day we would be limited to just 50 people present, so there will be NO MASS on that day, but we will open the Church for three hours for private prayer, so that people can come in to St Aloysius for a few minutes to remember the dead before the Blessed Sacrament. Because there isn't a formal 'service', names and contact details don't need to be recorded - but keep masked, distant and sanitised!
