Pope's Prayer Network Late on the eve of Pope Leo's departure for his first apostolic journey to Türkiye and Lebanon, *The Pope Video* for December was released. It is dedicated specifically to the Christian minorities who must live amid war. In this last prayer intention of 2025, the Holy Father asks that we pray "that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation and hope." He is the first to do so, reciting a prayer to the "God of peace," in the video produced and distributed by the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, with the collaboration of Vatican Media.
