Assisted Dying: What does it all mean?

Liam McArthur MSP is proposing a bill to legalise assisted dying. This will undermine the right tolife and put vulnerable people at risk of coming under pressure to end their lives prematurely. A series of Holyrood Webinars on Assisted Dying, Euthanasia and Palliative Care will be shown featuring Professor Marie Fallon, University of Edinburgh, Dr Miro Griffiths, University of Leeds, Dr Leonie Herx, Queens University, Kingston, Canada and Tanni Grey Thompson, television presenter and former wheelchair racer. Discussion will follow and Gordon McDonald, CEO of Care not Killing will be in attendance. All are welcome.

Sign Language Classes

Mass Readings

Week day readings at Mass now revert to Matthew's Gospel, and continue from the Sermon on the Mount (Chapter 5). The Sermon on the Mount has had great influence, often on people who are not Christians. Mahatma Gandhi was moved by its ideals, and once quipped when asked about Christianity that "it would be a good idea!"

ESOL Classes

The ESOL classes continue for teaching English to refugees. They are held Monday to Friday from 10am to 12pm, and have a team of about 45 teachers most of whom come for one day each week. The classes have now been running for over 6 years, and students graduate when they reach a certain level and then go to certain colleges.

Plans for the Future

We are beginning to think of plans to improve the two confessionals at the back of the church, and possibly to re-work the baptistry area, whilst at the same time upgrading the entrances. More details on this as ideas get formulated.

Hospital Pastoral Care

Remember (a) if you know you are going in to hospital and want Confession and the Sacrament of the Sick, please ask Canon Gargaro before you go, (b) if you are taken in as an emergency ask the nurse to contact the on-call chaplain or call the parish, and (c) if you are in hospital for a longer time you can receive Holy Communion regularly in the ward, but only if you ask the nurse or contact the parish. The chaplains will not be told you are in hospital and cannot visit you automatically – you must specifically ask to see the Catholic chaplain.

Jesuit Missions calls for the name of Fr Stan Swamy SJ to be cleared

Fr Stan Swamy, an Indian Jesuit priest and activist who spent five decades fighting for Indigenous rights in the state of Jharkhand, died of Covid-19 in July 2021 after spending 7 months in an Indian prison.

He was imprisoned under the archaic Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act for crimes against the government of India and his supposed involvement in violence surrounding the 2018 Bhima Koregaon protests.

In December 2022, Massachusetts-based digital forensics firm Arsenal Consulting reported the results of its investigation into the evidence which had led to Fr Swamy's arrest and imprisonment. The report concluded that Fr Swamy was systematically targeted in a cyber campaign over a four-year period during which time falsified evidence was planted on the priest's computer.

Fr Stan's willingness to stand with the poor and excluded eventually cost him his life. Today, Jesuit Missions are asking you to stand in solidarity with Stan by signing our petition which calls on the Indian government to clear the name of this innocent man, based on the new evidence.
