Dedication of the Lateran Basilica (c.324)

The Lateran Basilica was built by the Emperor Constantine on the Lateran Hill in Rome in about 324. The feast of its dedication has been celebrated in Rome on this date since the twelfth century. In honour of the basilica, "the mother and head of all the churches of the City and the World," the feast has been extended to the whole Roman Rite as a sign of unity and love towards the See of Peter, which, as St Ignatius of Antioch said in the second century, "presides over the whole assembly of charity."

SCOTTISH ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL -

STAGE 2 of the McArthur assisted suicide Bill is underway in the Scottish Parliament - this is the next major stage of this Bill, where there is line-by-line scrutiny, and amendments can be proposed and voted on. Over 250 amendments have been proposed to the Bill - a clear sign of how problematic the McArthur Bill is. You may recall that while the Scottish Bill passed its first hurdle at Stage 1, the vote was far closer than many commentators expected. We are informed that more than 20 MSPs who initially voted for the Bill have indicated they could vote against it at the final vote at Stage 3. If just seven of these MSPs switch their stance and vote against the Bill, it will be defeated at the Stage 3 vote. This can be won - but only if people like us act. If you have not yet asked your MSPs to vote against the Bill at Stage 3 please do so now. It only takes 30 seconds by clicking https://righttolife.org.uk/scotlandvoe?
