

Al in Ministry A day conference to help equip ministry Tuesday 23rd September 2025 10:00am – 4:00pm (Tea/coffee from 9:30am) Kirk at the Cross, Motherwell (formerly Dalziel St. Andrew's) Free to attend – booking via https://aiinministry.eventbrite.com

This one-day event is open to anyone involved in Christian ministry — ministers, pastors, priests, OLMs, deacons, chaplains, youth workers, and others — across all denominations. It's designed to be handson and highly practical, exploring how AI tools can support ministry in areas such as: Worship preparation and sermon writing, Publicity and social media, Video, image and music creation, Administration and planning, AI modelling for ministry use. The day will begin with a short reflection by Neil MacLennan (Sanctus Media) on "AI and Ministry: Issues to Think About," followed by collaborative, peer-led workshops. Participants are encouraged to bring a laptop and come ready to share ideas, tools, and experiences. The sessions and explorations will be a 'show and tell' feel with everyone learning from each other's experiences. The event is most suited to those who already have some IT literacy and ability as it will not be a basic introduction to technology. Those with limited IT skills may not get the most from the day, although everyone is welcome if they think they can learn and share together on the topic. Lunch is not provided, and people are invited to either bring their own or buy locally. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day.

Public Life Group If you have any old spectacles (for Lyons International Charities), postage stamps (for St Patrick's Missionaries) or old/new British/foreign coins/notes (for Mary's Meals). Please place in the box at the back of the church or hand into the office.

GIFT AID: Do you pay tax? Do you gift aid? For every £1 you contribute to the church, we can claim back an extra 25% of what you give. This is at NO EXTRA COST TO YOU! If you have an income (wage, salary, pension or investment income) on which you pay UK income tax, the tax people will add 25p for every pound you give. A Gift Aid Declaration can only be made in the name of an individual parishioner since tax is claimed back against his or her own tax. For each collection, a separate declaration must be made. This is a huge benefit to our parish. If you are a tax payer, please consider Gift Aid. Forms available from the back of the church or the office.

Pastoral Care in Hospitals: in an emergency there is a Catholic priest on call at each hospital 24 hours a day 7 days a week – just ask the nursing staff to call him. Anointing of the Sick, Holy Communion, and pastoral visits are available from the chaplains – again, just ask the nursing staff to arrange it or email Michael.odonnell@rcag.org.uk and they will come and see you. If you are going into hospital for planned surgery you can also ask oner of the priests for Anointing of the Sick here in the parish before you go.

Justice and Peace Scotland: On Saturday 2nd August, we will gather at Faslane for a Christian peace vigil in opposition to nuclear weapons. This ecumenical service of prayer, reflection, readings, and hymns will take place from 10.30am to 12 noon at the South Gate of HM Naval Base Clyde. We are keen to have a large and visible gathering at this year's vigil to mark 80 years since the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. To make it easier for people to attend, free transport is being provided by Justice & Peace Scotland and the Church of Scotland.
