Michael O'Duffin writes: I was recently part of a panel at the Catholic Chaplaincy of the University of Edinburgh discussing Science and Faith. It was recorded and broadcast by Radio Maria England. It also involved a Professor of Theoretical Physics from Cambridge, and two PhD students from Edinburgh – one working in palaeontology (mainly dinosaurs!) and another in sociology (researching the theology of the internet!). Electronic Donation System

We are preparing to re-start the electronic donation system, and it may help to know some details of this in advance:

First, to note that the usual collection system will continue to operate; the card reader donation system is an alternative.

Second, the plan is to have two card readers at the back of the church:

one of these will simply accept donations.

the other will be set for Gift Aid donations. This means:

The first time you use it, the machine will ask you for various details to validate the Gift Aid; it will then take your donation. Once you have done this for future donations the machine will automatically recognise your card, so it will simply accept the donation as Gift Aid.

The implication of this is that you could plan to make your first Gift Aid donation when things are quiet. After you have registered the action only takes a few seconds.
