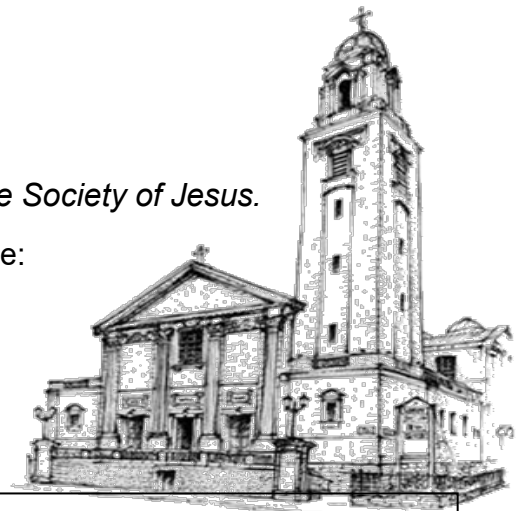

Celebrating the Golden Jubilee of the Canonisation of St John Ogilvie
Preparations for major celebrations to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the canonisation of St John Ogilvie in October 2026 are gathering pace.
