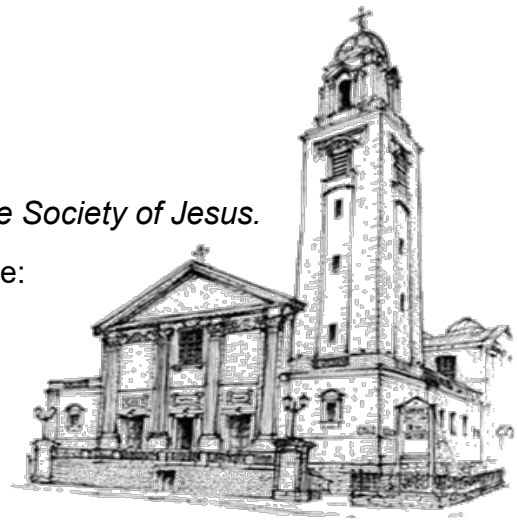

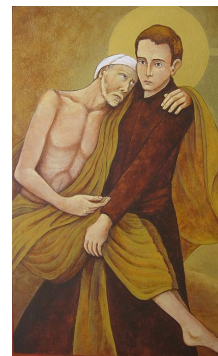

**DAY FOR LIFE** Every year the Church in Scotland, England, Wales, and Ireland marks the Day for Life, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year it will be celebrated on 15 June, Trinity Sunday. This year, Catholics are especially encouraged to pray for the sick and dying, for the safeguarding of palliative care, and for their MPs — urging them to resist legislation that undermines the sanctity of life. Amid debates over suffering and dignity, the Church's enduring message is clear: no life is without meaning, and no suffering is beyond the reach of God's love and hope.

Do you pay tax? Do you gift aid? For every £1 you contribute to the church, we can claim back an extra 25% of what you give. This is at NO EXTRA COST TO YOU! If you have an income (wage, salary, pension or investment income) on which you pay UK income tax, the tax people will add 25p for every pound you give. A Gift Aid Declaration can only be made in the name of an individual parishioner since tax is claimed back against his or her own tax. For each collection, a separate declaration must be made.
