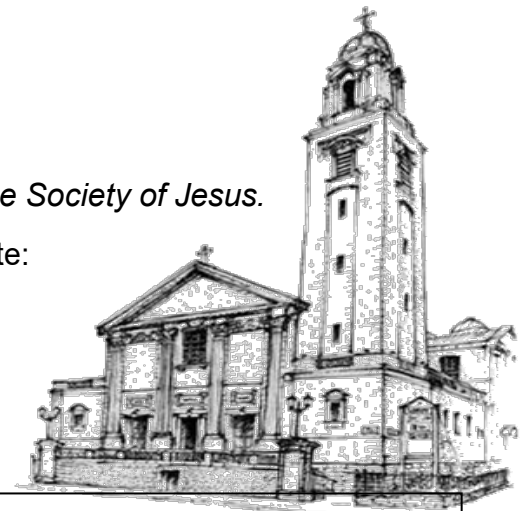

Fr Paul Hackett SJ (1930 – 2026) It is with sadness that we report that Fr Paul Hackett SJ

died early on the morning of Tuesday 26th May. May he rest in peace. **Paul Hackett** was 96 years old and in the 80th year of Religious Life. He had a long period of service in Scotland, starting at St Aloysius church in Glasgow and then at various places including Stornoway, Oban, Lochgilphead, St Andrew's and as parish priest at Kingussie. The final move of his long life as Jesuit was to Preston in 2018, where he assisted in the parish until infirmity did not allow him to do so further. Mass will be celebrated for the repose of his soul at 12.15 on Monday 1 June

Deacon Christopher Brolly SJ will be ordained to the priesthood in Newcastle on Saturday 13 June, He will be visiting St Aloysius' the weekend of 6th and 7th June.

The Feast of Saint Aloysius Sunday 21 June 2026

After 12 Noon Sund Mass, everyone is invited to lunch in the Ogilvie Centre (lift available). At this lunch we shall say farewell to our parish priest, Fr Gerard Mitchell SJ who will be leaving us at the beginning of July. All are welcome. Please do join us.

The Synod and the Synodal Process: Coordinated by the Synod Office in Rome, the Synodal Process is now in its third phase – the Implementation for a Synodal Church – which will continue until December 2026. Each diocese has been invited to share how our understanding of synodality has changed and how synodal practices have been, or might be, implemented in the life of our parishes.

A key aspect of this phase is a reading of the Final Document (FD; read online at aec.rcaos.org.uk/synod-implementation) from the XVI General Ordinary Assembly of the Synod of Bishops. This reading is to be supported and sustained by communal and personal prayer, centred on Christ and open to the Holy Spirit. The Final Document proposes to the whole Church and to every Baptized person the prospect of a journey of conversion: ‘the call to mission is, at the same time, the call to the conversion of each local Church and of the whole Church’ (FD 11)

Magnifica Humanitas is the title of **Pope Leo XIV’s first encyclical**, issued on **15 May 2026**, and it means “**Humanity in its Grandeur.**” It is a major teaching document on **safeguarding the human person in the age of artificial intelligence**. Pope Leo XIV uses the phrase to affirm that **human dignity is not negotiable**, even in a world shaped by AI, data systems, and technological power.
