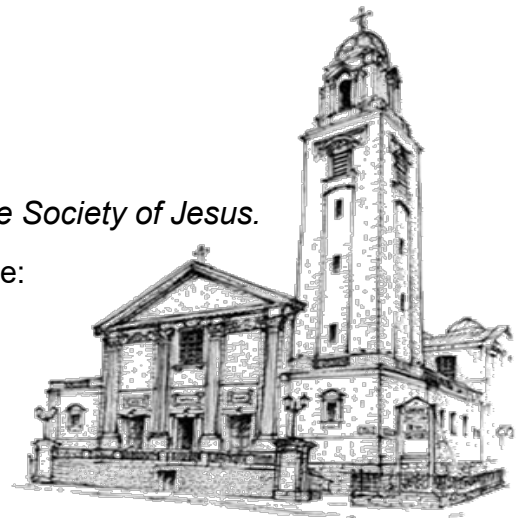

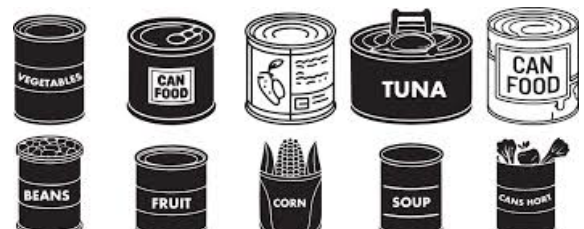

Commemorating the legacy of faith and unity. Join us to honour this historic milestone. Celebrate 1700 years since the First Council of Nicaea, a cornerstone of Christian history. Experience a service filled with prayer, reflection, and sacred music. Witness the unity and enduring significance of the Nicene Creed. Deepen your understanding of the Council of Nicaea and its impact on spiritual traditions. Be part of a celebration of Nicaea's enduring legacy. Celebrate history. Strengthen faith. Embody unity.

GIFT AID: Do you pay tax? Do you gift aid? For every £1 you contribute to the church, we can claim back an extra 25% of what you give. This is at NO EXTRA COST TO YOU! If you have an income (wage, salary, pension or investment income) on which you pay UK income tax, the tax people will add 25p for every pound you give. A Gift Aid Declaration can only be made in the name of an individual parishioner since tax is claimed back against his or her own tax. For each collection, a separate declaration must be made. 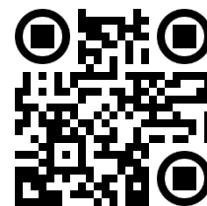
