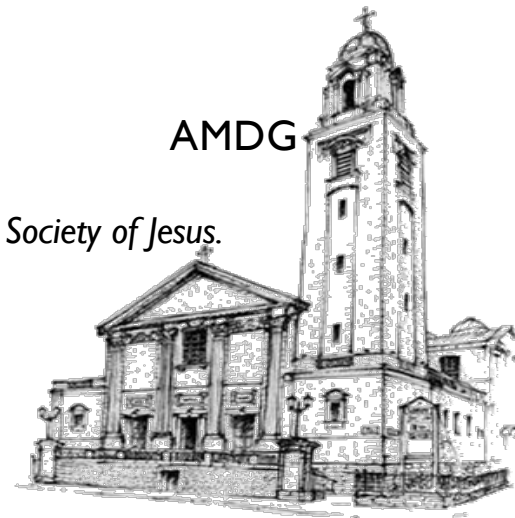

New Translation of the Lectionary and New Missals

In November, the translation of the scripture readings used at Mass is changing in Scotland. Since 1969, we have been using the Jerusalem Bible translation. With developments in translation techniques and biblical scholarship, the bishops have decided to switch to the English Standard Version translation. New missals are being produced which will include the new readings along with the new translation of the Mass texts which came out in 2010. There will be four versions of the people's Sunday Missal available: a standard hardback missal (£19.95); a white leather presentation edition (£29.95); a bonded leather hardback edition (£29.95); and a paperback edition for the year Advent 2024 to Christ the King 2025 (£9.95).
