

The Psalms

The Psalms are a set of 150 hymns sung in the temple in Jerusalem; supposedly written by King David, but more accurately written about King David. They enter every feeling and mood that a person has when they pray:

Assurance of God's care - e.g. 'The Lord is my Shepherd' Ps22

Admiration of God's creation - e.g. 'The heavens proclaim the glory of God' Ps 18

Repentance - e.g. 'Have mercy on me God in your kindness' Ps 50

Desolation - e.g. 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' Ps 21

Pilgrimage - e.g. 'I rejoiced when I heard them say, 'Let us go to God's house'.' Ps 121

Protection - e.g. 'O Lord you have been our refuge from one generation to the next.' Ps89

We hear extracts from the Psalms after the first reading at Mass, and Psalms are the basic part of the prayer of the church. It is worth having a copy of the Psalms, and they are a good way to get "into" the Old Testament. The best version is The Grail translation, widely available e.g. at St. Paul's Bookshop.

URGENT: Oppose plans to introduce Assisted Suicide to ScotlandCare Not Killing (CNK) supported by the Catholic Parliamentary Office, has launched a petition which aims to stop plans to legalise assisted suicide.Liam McArthur MSP, has indicated that he expects to introduce his assisted suicide bill at Holyrood in early 2023, so we must act quickly. This bill risks undermining the provision of palliative care and undermining efforts to prevent suicide. It will make the most vulnerable people, including the elderly and disabled, feel like a burden and its safeguards will prove futile. The current law is the safeguard - it prohibits assisting someone's suicide and/or killing them by euthanasia. The state ought to support the provision of care, not deliberate killing, for those at the end of life. Please sign CNK's petition today You will find the petition at the back of the church.
