Assisted Dying in Scotland

Later in 2023 Liam McArthur MSP is expected to publish a bill to legalise assisted dying in Scotland. The bill, which will allow assisted suicide for those who are terminally ill, mentally competent and who wish to die, will be debated and scrutinised by the Scottish Parliament and will eventually be voted on by MSPs in a free vote (not along party lines). Next Weekend 7/8 October Dr Gillian Wright will speak at Sunday Masses on Dying Well: How quality palliative care is the alternative to assisted suicide. Dr Wright is a medical doctor who trained in general hospital medicine and palliative care. She changed to work in the sphere of medical ethics in 2018 and worked for the Scottish Council on Human Bioethics in Edinburgh until 2020. She now works for the campaign Our Duty of Care, which opposes the introduction of assisted suicide and euthanasia to the UK.

The Catholic Parliamentary Office hosts 'Free2Pray', a webinar at 7.45pm on Tuesday 3 October highlighting a bill in the Scottish Parliament that could result in the imprisonment of anyone who prays or offers help near abortion centres.
