Stella Reekie: Glasgow's Interfaith Pioneer (1922-1982) Sunday 2nd of October, 2-4pm St Mungo Museum of Religious Life and Art, 2 Castle Street, G4 0RH

This year marks 100 years since the birth of Stella Reekie and 40 years since her death. A true trail blazer, Stella was a nurse and Church of Scotland missionary who worked with refugees and orphans during World War II, and later, in the 1970s, turned her Glasgow home into a safe space for dialogue and friendship among the increasingly diverse population in the Woodlands area. The Church of Scotland then purchased the "International Flat" in Glasgow Street, where Stella introduced many people on a journey of mutual learning and friendship that we are still benefiting from to this day. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes—I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!


