Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

This week's feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on Thursday, commemorates the finding of the cross by St. Helena in 327ad. The evidence that the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem is the actual location of the crucifixion of Jesus is quite strong. Consider: a) A crucifixion would take place outside the city. (The city itself is far too crowded); b) it would be near a gate of the city (both because that would be the nearest point outside the walls, and because the Romans used crucifixion to terrorize the population, so the entrance gate would ensure publicity; and c) The gate is likely to be the one closest to the governor's residence. Given archaeological research into the location of Jerusalem's city walls and gates at the time of Jesus, there is good evidence that the church of the Holy Sepulchre covers the place of Jesus' crucifixion.
