

Restoration

Our restoration plan for the work to be done in the Autumn is estimated to cost £330,000. However, with some proposed modifications it is likely to be near £350,000. As at 30th June we have about £230,000 available in our bank account, and with the Jesuit Province donation of £100,000 we are approaching our target. Note however, that it is prudent to have some reserve of say £50,000 in case of emergencies, such as the heating breaking down. But we are certainly going in the right direction, and warm thanks to the many who are contributing to the restoration.

We are about to begin the major renovation of the church which will include re-painting and new lighting, all to a new higher standard. Many thanks to all who have donated to the cost of this already. Boxes in the church marked 'RESTORATION' and for further donations which will be warmly appreciated.

Major Repair to the Church

From Monday 29th August, the church will be closed on **weekdays**, and Masses and Confessions Monday to Friday will be held in the Ignatian Spirituality Centre in Scott Street. Although it is a bit of a walk up Hill Street we hope you will still come; you will find it a variation from the normal pattern to have Mass in the new location.

For **week-ends** from September, Mass and Confessions will be held in the church. The front half will be scaffolded, but the rear will be available, with a special layout of benches. Note that this applies to Saturday Masses, to Confessions, and to all Sunday Masses; also to exposition on Sunday afternoons.

We regret that for the first six weeks of the redecoration work wheelchair access will not be possible to the church.

Note that the Ogilvie Centre continues to function during the work, but there will be no access to the church on weekdays.

Baptisms are possible in the church when the week-ends are available, but not recommended.

St. Patrick's have kindly said they are willing to host funerals from us during this period.

We regret the inconvenience this will caused, but believe that if we all work together we will cope with the difficulties. The work will be finished shortly before Christmas.

National Pilgrimage to Carfin – Sunday 25th September 2022

This is a very special year and the National Pilgrimage is on Sunday 25th September. It is a special year as its marks the Centenary of the Grotto and that in itself is reason enough to encourage a strong and wide participation in the Pilgrimage. Also, the Relics of St Bernadette will be with us at Carfin that day and will remain there throughout the rest of that week. Holy Mass in Honour of Our Lady of Lourdes and St Bernadette, and in Thanksgiving for the 100 Years of the Grotto, will be 3pm, with the Rosary Procession afterwards. The Bishop of Motherwell will lead the Liturgy along with fellow bishops and priests. All welcome to join this special day.
